Kennedy Park has ball diamonds, shuffleboard courts, playground equipment and a gazebo with picnic tables, restroom facilities, bikepath, skate park, horseshoe pits and 4 tennis courts.

**Rodebaugh Park**  
Rodebaugh Road  
This neighborhood park is equipped with playground equipment, picnic tables and a grill.

**Huber Park**

Huber Park has 5 ball diamonds, playground, bikepath, restroom facilities and it is bordered by beautiful Blacklick Creek.



**Livingston House and Park**

This historic landmark was the home of Alexander W. Livingston, founder of the Paragon variety of the tomato. The park is in a country setting with the beautifully restored Livingston House, gardens, walkway and playground equipment. Private tours can be arranged.

**Civic Park**

Civic Park has 4 adult softball diamonds, playground, basketball court, soccer fields, restroom facilities and a concession stand, as well as natural areas, paths, and a new 1.3 mile trail.

## Registration Dates

Registration begins, unless otherwise noted, when the program brochure is available for distribution. Registration ends, unless otherwise noted, upon fulfillment of the program, or 48 hours prior to the start of the program, whichever comes first. Please do not wait until the last minute to register. Many programs also fill quickly.

## Registration/Cancellation Policies

- Registration form must be completely filled out. Please remember to sign the waiver. Registrations with incomplete forms will not be accepted.
- All dates, times, locations and grade divisions are subject to change.
- Fees must be paid at registration; we accept cash, check, money order, VISA and Mastercard (credit cards in person only). Only receipt of payment reserves a spot in a program. No holds accepted. Registrations are first-come, first-served with completed form and complete payment.
- Cancellations: We'll contact you only if a class is cancelled or full, or a program change has been made. If you don't hear from us, attend the first class session as described in this brochure. \*Registrants requesting a refund prior to the start of the class/program will be assessed a \$7 service fee. **Once a program/event has begun (1st practice, session, etc.), NO REFUND WILL BE GIVEN.**
- All participants registering for age or grade-specific programs must be the minimum age or grade listed by the first day the program meets. No exceptions will be made to this policy to ensure program integrity is maintained for participants.
- Classes are cancelled two working days prior to the first class if enrollment is insufficient to hold the program. A full refund will be issued should this occur.

- If Reynoldsburg City Schools are cancelled due to inclement weather, all Parks and Recreation programs will be cancelled for that day. Reynoldsburg Fieldhouse programs are the only exception. Listen to radio broadcasts for school cancellation information. You can also call our activity status hotline at 322-6834 for the latest cancellation information.
- Sports League Registration: Please note that each league has a specific registration period. The registration dates and times listed for each league will be strictly enforced. All registrations must be received prior to 5:00 pm on the last date listed.

## Resident/Non-Resident Fee Schedule

**Resident:** Participant whose family lives, works or owns property within the Reynoldsburg School District. In other words, you must pay Reynoldsburg School taxes.

**Non-Resident:** Participant outside the Reynoldsburg School District. Possessing a Reynoldsburg mailing address does not always qualify as being a resident due to the fact that the above mentioned taxes may not be paid. Fees are noted as a dollar amount. **Can I register for classes online?** At this time, registration is not available online.

**I haven't heard from my coach yet. When will I?** Be patient! Please do not call the Recreation office. You will receive a phone call from your coach regarding the first meeting time. Please remember that coaches are volunteers.

**Are there spots available in a certain program?** You can view the number of openings online.

# Information For You!

## People are not allergic to rainwater!

For years, the goal of municipal designers and city ordinances has been to hustle every drop of rainwater out of town as quickly as possible, as if people were allergic to it. This rapid removal of rain water before it has time to soak into the ground causes many problems.

Most people are familiar with chemical and biological pollution. There are two more types of "pollution" caused by traditional methods of property development. They are increased speed and volume of runoff (resulting in increased flooding and erosion downstream) and thermal pollution. The immediate causes are the loss of shade and the increase of impervious area created by suburban and urban construction. "Impervious area" in this case means that rain water runs off immediately into the streams. This "first flush" of storm water usually contains the highest concentration of pollutants, picked up from the air and washed off from contaminated surfaces.

Normally the majority of rain water that falls on vegetated soil is used by the plants or soaks into the soil and provides water for wells and permanent streams. Normal vegetation also provides shade to keep the ground and small streams cool. Sun-baked pavement can get very hot and the first storm water to runoff from it is usually very warm or even hot. Many fish and organisms live and reproduce in limited temperature ranges and cannot thrive in this heated and polluted water.

In recent years, there has been a growing movement to capture rainwater and reduce the volume of runoff. Private citizens have been participating in this movement by installing rain gardens and rain barrels. In some cases people have been able to provide vegetated buffer zones and conservation easements alongside waterways. All of these practices reduce the first flush of storm water that enters the streams.

Rain barrels, by reducing the need to use city water for watering lawns and flower gardens, can reduce the owner's water bill. Information on acquiring, installing, and using rain barrels can be obtained from your county's soil and water conservation service. Remember rain barrels and rain gardens are safe, if you are not allergic to rainwater!
